Pressure from family.

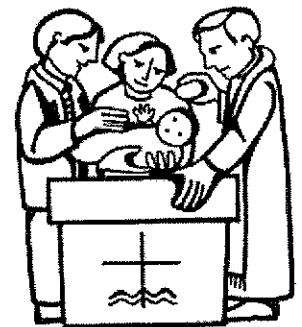
I want my child to be part of the church.
